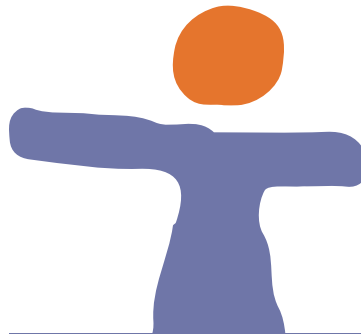

Pathways to Sobriety

This gender-specific, intensive, substance abuse program is based on a 4-Step Model and focuses on life skills enhancement, diet, nutrition, eating disorders, resiliency, group instruction, and the development of self-esteem.

Bridging Communication

This lecture series is for parents wanting to learn new techniques to set healthy boundaries with their teenagers to deter high-risk behavior. Family mediation is also available.

Ten-Week Programs

Paying It Forward

The Paying It Forward Program provides students with unique and meaningful volunteer opportunities while addressing community needs.

Young Women's Voices

This all-girls class covers healthy decision making, building confidence and resilience, media awareness, connection, bonding, and more. This class prepares girls transitioning into womanhood as they become the next generation of leaders.

Seven-Week Programs

Power of Conversation

Classes are designed to provide a structured group setting that can be utilized by teens who find themselves in recurring incidents with peers and in their schools.

Young at Heart

Fosters ethical, responsible, and caring young people by modeling social and emotional learning as well as appreciation for diversity. Students identify skills when choosing friends and peer groups, while building healthy relationships.

Navigating Life in Teen Transition

Explores the dangers and attitudes regarding alcohol, marijuana, and other substances. Students analyze their behavior and learn about the lifelong consequences that occur when substances are abused.
